



## Gun Violence Prevention Challenge Summit & Hack-a-thon

Trained in both internal medicine and pediatrics, Tim is a practicing primary care physician and CEO of Massachusetts General Physicians Organization, the largest of Harvard Medical School's faculty physician groups. As Senior Vice President for Population Health at Partners Healthcare, Tim led the design and implementation of system-wide care delivery changes to improve patient health and reduce the healthcare cost burden, managing cost and quality of care for over 600,000 Medicare, Medicaid and commercially insured patients. Previously, as Medical Director at Mass General, he was the principal investigator for a six-year Medicare demonstration project involving an alternative payment method that showed how care coordination can both reduce costs and reduce mortality among high risk Medicare beneficiaries. Tim has over 100 publications in the areas of healthcare quality measurement, risk adjustment, population health management, and health information technology. He has served on multiple committees for the National Academy of Medicine, Agency for Healthcare Research and Quality, National Quality Forum, and the Health Information Technology Policy Committee. He has served as a consultant to the Congressional Research Service, National Governors Association, the World Health Organization, the Institute for Healthcare Improvement, and the British National Health Service. He is currently a member of the Physician Focused Payment Model Technical Advisory Committee that advises the Secretary of Health and Human Services on opportunities to improve care and reduce healthcare costs using alternative payment models.
